- Dissertation Title: It Was All A Dream: Pittsburgh Black Musicians Local 471- Collective Memory and Alternate Truths
- Dissertation Advisor: Dr. Laurence Glasco
- This project consists of an analysis of Local 471 between 1940 and 1966. It examines the historical landscape that evolved as local black jazz musicians thrived socially and economically during segregation but found work opportunities lessening as the 1960's approached. Concurrent racial, social, and economic factors created tremendous pressure on Local 471 to protect the welfare of its clients. Unfulfilled expectations after the merger between Local 60 and Local 471 left many black musicians bitter and doubtful about the true merits of integrationist policy in eradicating racism.
